The project “Digital Inclusive Tool” (Digitool) will train teachers working in mainstream education to work with autistic students, using information and communication technology (ICT).

Autistic people are often at a disadvantage at schools due to the inaccessibility of the environment and their support needs being unmet. During the COVID-19 lockdown, online education also proved to be inaccessible for a majority of autistic learners. It highlighted the need to further develop ICT inclusive education across Europe.

The project will raise awareness of the need for a new inclusive ICT approach that addresses the needs of autistic learners and promotes the communication, socialization and learning of these students.

Expected results:

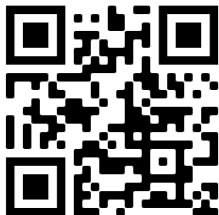
- An innovative pilot training course for teachers in ICT tools to work with and support autistic students;
- Implementation of the course for up to 90 education professionals. Beyond the theoretical component, the course will also have a practical component in which the trainees will apply the knowledge acquired with autistic students;
- Elaboration of a European Multi-resource ICT kit
